

Our Patron, St. Thérèse was like many other young children. Little Thérèse was blond, blue-eyed, affectionate, stubborn, and alarmingly precocious. She could throw a giant-sized tantrum. Her bubbling laughter

could make a gargoyle smile.

Thérèse thrived on the love which surrounded her in a Christian home. It was there where prayer, the liturgy, and practical good works formed the basis of her ardent love of Jesus —— her desire to please Him and the Virgin Mary. Saint Thérèse said: "Holiness consists simply of doing God's will and being just what God wants us to be."

Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic

Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45).
