



We have now received approximately 50% of the Volunteer Information forms that were distributed to our Little Flower Parish Volunteers. Thank you!

If you have not completed and submitted your form, we ask that you do so as soon as possible.

You May Ask Why the Volunteer Information form should be completed?

The Archdiocese has implemented a procedure, called Protocol for Responsible Parish Ministry, which provides the same level of protection for members of all the parishes in the Archdiocese. To ensure the protection of Little Flower Church community members, volunteers are required to complete a basic information form. The information is confidential, and the forms remain on file at Little Flower for 7 years after death or the parishioner leaves the parish. After that period of time parish records are forwarded to the Archdiocesan Archives for their historical records. These historical records include documents dating back to the late 1800s. Completed forms can be dropped off in the Pamphlet room. A pink basket for these forms is located on the window ledge by the entry door to the parish office.

itwewin Corner (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...')

Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee.

Did you know... White Bear First Nation (https:// whitebearfirstnation.ca) is located 13 kms North of Carlyle, Sask. in the scenic Moose Mountain area and consists of four First Nations (Cree, Saulteaux, Nakota, and Dakota). Chief Wahpemakwa signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 in 1875. The population is approximately 2900 members with 70% who live off reserve. The Bear Claw Casino opened in 1993 and was shut down because of a contentious battle with the provincial government regarding gaming in Saskatchewan. The federal government was also involved which led to a major change in the Indian Act of 1876. The Permit System was rescinded - a historic win for First Nations across Canada. Prior to 1996, First Nations had to get permission from the federal government to establish a business on their land. The Bear Claw Casino reopened in 1996.
