#### Offering of the Mass

By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making an atonement so that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses may be requested through the parish office.

If you wish to have the Mass offered on a specific date, please make arrangements at least one month in advance.

#### **Reflection:**

Malachi 1:14-2:2,8-10| 1Thess. 2:7-9,13 | Matt. 23,1-12 In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus tells the people that the religious leaders of the day, the Scribes and the Pharisees, do not practice what they preach. They seem to be using their positions of power for their own glory. Christ uses this example to teach a lesson; "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." In the second reading, St. Paul and his companions are in Thessalonica doing the Lord's work proclaiming the Gospel, and they give thanks for the ability to do so. They are there to serve the Lord, to show the people the truth of the Gospel and to rejoice with them as they convert to Christ. This is stewardship in action!

There's nothing wrong with being appreciated for our talents. But as Christians, disciples, and stewards of God's many gifts, we must always remember that all good things come from God, and we must live our lives in humble service and in gratitude for all God has given us.

As stewards of God's many gifts, be mindful that these are entrusted to us to use to serve the Lord.
