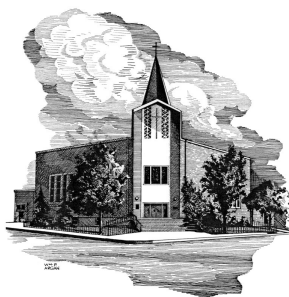

Lay Formation

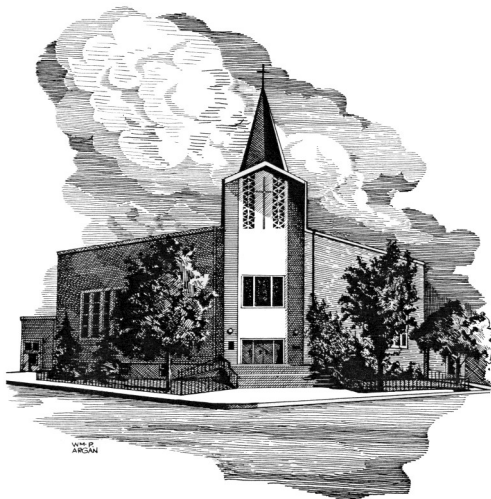
