



#### Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This

practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sinoffering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.

#### St. Thérèse



At the time St. Thérèse was born, Zèlie Martin was most likely in the early stages of the breast cancer. Considering her health Zèlie found it difficult to care for her newborn baby. Thérèse was not thriving and after three months, the ailing infant was fostered out to Rose Taillè. Rose

took over the task during the next twelve months and reared Thérèse into a happy, sun tanned, precocious toddler. Thérèse described herself as bossy and temperamental and frequently given to tears when things didn't go her way.

St. Thérèse said: "Jesus, help me to simplify my life by learning what you want me to be, and help me to become that person."

#### Easter 2025: Celebrating Together to Strengthen Unity

In 2025 Christians from all traditions will celebrate Easter on the same day, 20 April. But in many years major Christian traditions celebrate Easter on different dates, thus giving the impression of a divided witness to this fundamental aspect of the Christian faith. Since the 16th century, Eastern and Western churches have used different calendars to calculate the date of Easter, and only rarely do they coincide. The search for a common date for Easter was also one of the central issues of the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea, whose 1700th anniversary is being celebrated in 2025. This webinar will bring together people from different traditions - Coptic, Eastern Orthodox, Catholic, and Lutheran - to explore how a shared celebration of Easter can unite Christians worldwide in their common faith in the resurrected Christ.
