CPCS Workshop: A Victim-Centered Approach: Best Practices for Accompaniment, Reducing Re-Victimization and Dealing with a Legacy of Clergy Sexual Abuse

Bradford Fahlman, Archbishop Donald Bolen Over the last five years the Archdiocese of Regina has embarked on a progressive dialogue with victims of clergy sexual abuse in an on-going effort to change the way those who were abused were treated. In this workshop the Archdiocesan Core Working Group members will share and discuss the best practices that have led to practical and tangible ways to provide a victim-centered approach that helps people impacted by the legacy of clergy sexual abuse and works to educate non-victims. Topics addressed include a victim sharing how abuse impacted her life, transparency, and accountability from a victim's perspective, accompanying and reaching out to victims, and educational and parish resources, all aimed at reducing re-victimization and initiating a change of culture around the exercise of authority. *Please note that the sessions will be recorded and shared with registered participants The registration fee for the general public is \$50.00

Did you know that... Paul Acoose [1885-1978] from Zagime [Sakimay] Anishinabek First Nation, Saskatchewan was a world class distance runner. In 1909 he turned professional and went on to win many races. He travelled to New York where he finished second in a 20 mile race in Madison Square Gardens. On March 30, 1910, Paul defeated Tom Longboat [winner of the 1907 Boston Marathon] in a 12 mile race in Toronto. He was inducted into the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame in 1983.
