
Men's Club Breakfast

Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee. Did you know... Piapot First Nation is a Cree Nation located south of Regina and has a population of approximately 2500 members who live on and off reserve. Chief Payepot (Payipwat meaning A Hole in the Sioux) signed Treaty 4 on September 9, 1875. He and other Cree chiefs refused to sign other

treaties with the Canadian government and established themselves in Cypress Mountain, however, the government began to fear that these bands would join and would be impossible to control. Indian Commissioner, Edgar Dewdney, put in a policy of famine to force the bands to leave this area. Chief Piapot became a person of https:// piapotnation.com/history-2/ for his continued efforts to fight for the rights of his people.

A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

Night Terrors

The over-arousal of the central nervous system (CNS) resulting in intense screaming, crying, thrashing or fear during sleep that happens again and again. A night terror is a sleep disorder in which a person quickly awakens from sleep in a terrified state. The person can be hard to awaken, confused when awakened, and may only remember bits and pieces or nothing at all.

What is National Indigenous Peoples Day (NIPD)?

June 21 is National Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of First Na-

tions, Inuit and Métis peoples. The Canadian Constitution recognizes these three groups as Aboriginal peoples, also known as Indigenous peoples.

Although these groups share many similarities, they each have their own distinct heritage, language, cultural practices and spiritual beliefs.

In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21, the summer solstice, for National Aboriginal Day, now known as National Indigenous Peoples Day. For generations, many Indigenous peoples and communities have celebrated their culture and heritage on or near this day due to the significance of the summer solstice as the longest day of the year.
