Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Children, ages 3-6, accept the paschal mystery, the death AND resurrection, as one event that lives in their heart. When the children work with the apostles and Jesus at the Last Supper in the upper room, their hearts know that the story doesn't end there. They know Jesus rises because He loves us. Anthony, age 5, when working with these materials gathered all of the apostles in the room around the table and sang, "We love you," over and over again. And then, he placed Jesus back into the room and declared, "We missed you!" He then took the arms of the apostles and wrapped them around Jesus in a big hug. I wonder how much God loves us to die and rise for us? I wonder how we would respond if the Resurrected Christ appeared in front of us? Would we also declare, "I missed you!" and give Jesus a big bear hug?
