July July 3, 2022 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time



"He said to them, 'The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few...' " Luke 10:2

As Catholics we are all called to serve. Each of us has been given "charismas" otherwise known as gifts from the Holy Spirit to help build God's Church. Our charismas can only be used for good. We know that we are using them in the right ministry when we are filled with joy and we want to share stories about our charitable works. Discern how God is calling you to use your charismas. Say "yes" to what God is calling you to do and then do it! Share your joy and invite others to do the same.

July 10, 2022 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'" Luke 10:37 This was Jesus' command at the end of the Good Samaritan story. Did you know that the Samaritans and Jews despised each other? The moral of the story is to love our neighbor.
