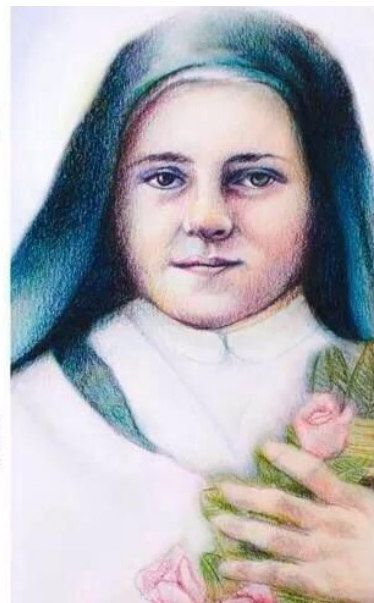

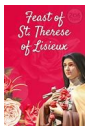

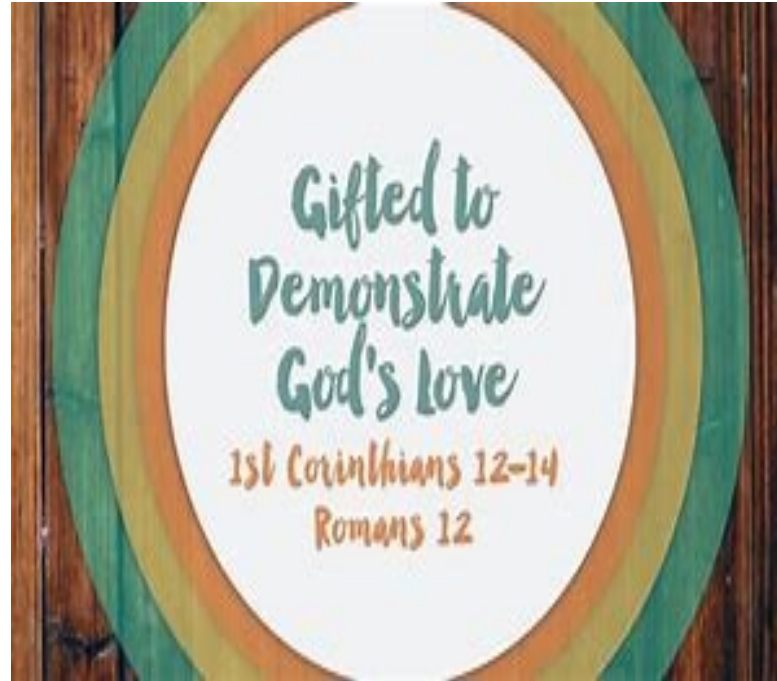
Sept. 29, 30 and Oct. 1 - St. Therese Triduum

Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making an atonement so that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses may be requested through the parish office.

Stewardship Bulletin Bits - September 25, 2022

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time



"My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established..."

Luke 16:25-26

When God created the world He declared that it was good and He gave it to all mankind for us to enjoy. However, over the years we have created a chasm between those who have great gifts and those who do not. In today's Gospel we see that with our own generosity we must bridge that gap between those who have much and those who have little or we may find ourselves on the wrong side of the chasm in the next life.

Heroes aren't Perfect



Heroes aren't perfect. In today's society, the media is constantly digging up the skeletons in the closet of those we admire most, but this does not make them any less of a hero. Look at the book of

Judges filled with twelve heroes who freed Israel from its oppressors.

But these twelve were far from perfect, among them was an assassin (Judges 3:20-24) and a sexually promiscuous man (Judges 16:1-2).

Even with these faults, they (eventually) obeyed God and were used by Him to accomplish great things.

If you think you have strayed too far away from God to ever be used by Him, think again. God's door is always open and His mission for your life doesn't expire till your last breath. You can be a hero, even with your shortcomings. Sometimes it is our faults that finally point us in the right direction, to obey and trust God's plan, and be the hero He has called us to be.

Did You Know?



Itwewin Corner (itwewin is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...') Fr. John Weckend, Archdiocese of Regina Truth and Reconciliation Healing Committee.

Did you know... Treaty 4 was negotiated on September 15, 1874, in what is now known as Fort Qu'Appelle. The parties to the agreement were the Nêhiyawak (Cree), Anishinabêk (Saulteaux), Nakota (Assiniboine) First Nations and the British Crown (Canada). Treaty 4 is celebrated annually during the week of its anniversary on the traditional lands and territory of First Nations in the Qu'Appelle Valley. The Treaty 4 Gathering concludes with a powwow which is enjoyed by non-Indigenous and Indigenous peoples who travel from near and far to join the celebration.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation



The Canadian government proclaimed September 30th as a new national statutory holiday, a National day for Truth and Reconciliation to honour survivors, their families, and communities. The Catholic Church has a significant role and responsibility for Truth and Reconciliation in Canada. With the recent visit of Pope Francis on his Penitential Pilgrimage to Canada, this day gives us an opportunity to reflect on the history of residential schools, and grow in our understanding towards a commitment to true healing and reconciliation.
