back of the Church; Cost is \$4 each.


Offering of the Mass

Holly Week, 8 days of Easter



Holy Week is a string of eight days that allow us an opportunity to reflect upon the shift in humanity Jesus' sacrifice on the cross HOLY WEEI launched. It starts with Palm Sunday when Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem.

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on what we now call Palm Sunday; palm branches, which symbolize triumph or victory, were strewn in Jesus' path, as He rode into the city. He rode into town on a humble donkey, fulfilling the prophecy in **Zechariah 9:9**: "Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your kings comes to you, righteous and victorious, low and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." The people welcomed Him, echoing the words of Psalm 118:25-26: "Lord, save us! Lord, grant us success!" more popularly recognizes as "Hosanna! Hosanna!"

The week leads us through the Last Supper, His crucifixion, and ends on Easter Sunday with His resurrection. This is the basis of Christianity, His sacrifice launched the New Covenant God promised and many had prophesied throughout the Old Testament.

Each day of Holy Week allows us to peek into the heart of our Savior at intently close proximity. His love for us is reflected in every significant step toward the cross, every breath up to the last, and His resurrection.

Holy Week is a sacred opportunity to study the foundation of Christianity. Our God is not one of coincidence. Every step toward the cross was intentional, every lesson laced with His personal love for all of us.


